Bill #2: CPPI Endorses Safe & Affordable Drugs From Canada Act Senators Klobuchar & Grassley Introduce Bill to Ensure Americans Access to Affordable, Critical Daily Medications



WASHINGTON, D.C. – Today, the <u>Campaign for Personal Prescription</u> <u>Importation (CPPI)</u> released a statement endorsing the "<u>Safe and Affordable Drugs From Canada Act of 2024 (S. 4918)</u>," introduced by <u>Senators Amy Klobuchar (D-MN)</u> and <u>Chuck Grassley (R-IA)</u>. The bill is co-sponsored by Senators Tammy Baldwin (D-WI), Sherrod Brown (D-OH), Angus King (I-ME), Jeff Merkley (D-OR), Jeane Shaheen (D-NH), and Sheldon Whitehouse (D-RI).

"Expanding access to imported medicines for personal use through the 'Safe and Affordable Drugs From Canada Act' saves American lives, as more than one hundred thousand CPPI Members can attest," says Campaign for Personal Prescription Importation (CPPI) executive director, Jack Pfeiffer. "CPPI applauds Senators Amy Klobuchar and Chuck Grassley for their long-standing commitment to allow for the safe importation of less expensive medicines from Canada. This key legislation would ensure Americans have access to life-saving drugs at a fraction of the cost through personal importation."

<u>Current law</u> allows personal importation of prescription drugs on a case-by-case basis, and directs the FDA to exercise discretion in permitting personal importation of drugs when the product is "clearly for personal use, and does not appear to present an unreasonable risk to the user." Licensed Canadian pharmacies, ship products to Americans through the postal service and help patients, mostly seniors, obtain affordable medications for their chronic conditions such as COPD, diabetes and high blood pressure.

<u>Price comparisons</u> demonstrate that identical medications from Canada cost up to 90 percent less than the price charged in the United States, with the top 60 drugs sold in America costing nearly four times as much as Canada. Recent <u>surveys</u> reveal that more than one-third of Americans do not fill their prescriptions

due to cost. Meanwhile, Americans who import their medications report saving an average of \$4,920 a year.

"It's time now for Congress and the Administration to deliver immediate relief to American patients and advance personal prescription importation," says CPPI Executive Director Jack Pfeiffer.


REUTERS: US will still pay at least twice as much after negotiating drug prices

The U.S. government's first-ever negotiated prices for prescription drugs are still on average more than double, and in some cases five times, what drugmakers have agreed to in four other high-income countries, a Reuters review has found.

The U.S. Medicare health plan, which covers more than 67 million people, recently unveiled new maximum prices, for the first 10 high-cost medicines negotiated under the Biden Administration's Inflation Reduction Act.

Prices for drugs included in U.S. Medicare's first negotiations

The Biden administration selected 10 prescription medicines for unprecedented price negotiations by the Medicare health program for older Americans that covers 67 million people last year, and announced new prices for those last month to go into effect in 2026. Here's how the price of a 30-day supply stacks up against other countries' 2024 prices, all in U.S. dollars.

Senator Rubio Re-Introduces The DRUGS Act to Deny Seniors Access to Affordable Medicines

Florida Senator Marco Rubio quietly re-introduced the Domain Reform for Unlawful Drug Sellers Act (DRUGS Act) [S. 4108], a bill that would prevent Americans from accessing safe and affordable daily prescription medicines from licensed Canadian pharmacies.



In response, the <u>Campaign for Personal Prescription Importation (CPPI)</u> has hand-delivered a <u>letter</u> to Florida Senator Marco Rubio, opposing the re-introduced DRUGS Act.

"Floridians and Americans are already struggling with rising inflationary costs in all aspects of life. The DRUGS Act would deny seniors on fixed incomes access to the only affordable route to their daily medications. The DRUGS Act puts lives in jeopardy," says CPPI Executive Director Jack Pfeiffer. "We hope Senator Marco Rubio, listens to the Floridians and Americans, and withdraws the DRUGS Act."

Jerry Phillips from Holiday, Florida is a Campaign for Personal Prescription Importation member and a volunteer for the State Health Insurance Assistance Program. He helps seniors with their Medicare questions and issues. Phillips says, "The single biggest problem that these seniors face is the cost of new, highly advertised and promoted drugs. I personally use a Canadian pharmacy to get one of my medications, saving me \$800 per year. Without this option, I could not afford it. The DRUGS Act would rob Americans like me of one of the only avenues for safe and affordable prescription medications - licensed international pharmacies."

Dr. Linda Christmann of Bradenton, Florida says, "For the past several years, my husband and I have benefited from purchasing drugs through one or both of two Canadian pharmacies. Last year we saved over \$1900 by doing so. I have had no concerns about my safety in buying my drugs this way. Please keep this pathway open for us all."

Emma Soffer of Naples, Florida says, "I have a heart condition & take many medications which run me over \$400 per month. I cannot afford these medications so to survive I must be allowed to get my medications from Canada.

As long as USA suppliers continue to charge such outrageous amounts for the drugs that Americans need to survive people like me have no alternative but to purchase the needed medications online from Canada. Please oppose the DRUGS ACT."

The <u>Campaign for Personal Prescription Importation (CPPI)</u> released the above new price comparison of the most sought-after brand-name prescription drugs revealing that average Canadian drug prices are 50% to 90% less expensive than leading U.S. pharmacy prices.

Earlier in July, President Joe Biden and Senator Bernie Sanders issued a warning in <u>USA Today</u> to pharmaceutical companies stating, "If Novo Nordisk and other pharmaceutical companies refuse to substantially lower prescription drug prices in our country and end their greed, we will do everything within our power to end it for them."
